## Show Bible: Life's Curve

The power of fulfilling final requests to heal the past and inspire the future.

**Logline:** A former professional baseball player partners with an enigmatic heiress to fulfill the final wishes of the dying, confronting their own pasts and uncovering the power of love, redemption, and legacy.

These shows highlight the art of balancing emotionally charged storytelling with episodic arcs that captivate viewers, all while driving the personal growth and human connections of their central characters. *Life's Curve* carves out its unique space in the television landscape by blending profound emotional stakes with dynamic, fresh weekly stories.
